

Australian Resuscitation Council Ian Jacobs Fellowship

Instructions to applicants

Please read these instructions carefully before completing the application form.

Aims of the Fellowship

Professor Ian Jacobs served the Australian Resuscitation Council for 25 years and excelled in national and international resuscitation research, knowledge dissemination and collaboration.

The Australian Resuscitation Council has established the Ian Jacobs Fellowship as a lasting tribute to his memory.

The ARC Ian Jacobs Fellowship is awarded annually at the discretion of the ARC to meritorious applicants with the aims of supporting national and international resuscitation investigation and knowledge dissemination.

Preference will be given to projects that:

- can provide evidence to known gaps in scientific knowledge.
- are likely to be completed within 12months.

Previous awardees are not eligible.

Animal studies will not be funded.

Applications

Application forms may be obtained from the ARC website (http://resus.org.au).

Handwritten, incomplete and late applications will not be accepted.

Please include a CV with the application.

Award Funding

The annual value of the Fellowship is up to \$10,000. Recipients may request a time extension in writing, but no additional funding will be provided.

Funds may be used for costs related to the research project, including salary to complete the research and small items of equipment necessary to complete the project. Cost must be detailed and justified.

Funds may not be used for:

- stipends for Higher Degree Research Students (e.g. Master or PhD)
- travel, entertainment or publication costs
- computers or software

Ethical clearance

Proof of ethics approval, if necessary to complete the project as outlined, must be received before the funding will be released.

Progress and financial reporting

Successful recipients must provide a progress reports to the ARC at completion of the project and annually for projects with approved extensions.

Completed projects are to be submitted and presented at the next available International Spark of Life Conference (at the recipient's expense).

Acknowledgement

The Australian Resuscitation Council must be acknowledged in any presentations and publications arising from the research undertaken as a result of this funding.

Application assessment

A panel of ARC Council Members will review the applications. Suitable applications will be presented to the ARC Council.

There is no appeal process. The ARC reserves the right to apply the research funding as it deems appropriate.
