The RACP CPD Program is a self-directed and self-reporting program.

Physicians' record and report on their own continuing professional development activities annually. It is the responsibility of individual physicians to select the activities appropriate for their continuing professional development and to claim the appropriate level of points.

RACP members should be aware that the ARC has consulted the College and believe that the ALS/ILS Course meets the criteria set out in the College Guidelines for CPD Providers - available at:

Should participants in the **RACP MyCPD** Program wish to claim credits for attending the course to learn new techniques e.g. Advanced Life Support (ALS – ARC advanced life support level 2) and Immediate Life Support (ILS – ARC advanced life support level 1) courses, they would claim them under:

**"Category 4: Structured Learning Projects" at 3 credit per hour.**

The ARC ALS course length is stated as 18 hours duration over the two days and the ILS course 8 hours.

Suitable documentation to provide proof of participation would be registration form or program of the event and certificate of completion of the course.

RACP Fellows may contact the College for advice regarding the appropriate level of credits to claim if they require assistance.
